- Prioritize equipment to be decontaminated
- Wear Personal Protective Equipment
- Participate in a medical evaluation/surveys at designated intervals as established by Incident Command
- Be housed separately from the public
- Have access to medical support personnel 24/7
- Operate in shifts as designated by Incident Command. No personnel will demobilize the site without written authorization.
- Continue to be medically surveyed for signs and symptoms. Action plans will be in place per Incident Command recommendations and reports will be submitted, as requested.

PROVEN DECONTAMINATION APPROACH

- Phase 1: Gross decon removal by removing excess dirt & debris.
- ♦ Phase 2: Spray solution on surfaces and allow to sit.
- Phase 3: Final spray & wipe to remove any remaining solution and/or residue.
- Phase 4: Collect & containerize all consumables used in the decon process for proper disposal.
- Phase 5: Conduct confirmation wipe sampling, if directed.
- ♦ Phase 6: Personnel exit hot zone.
